Instructions: The Servicem em bers Civil Relief Act applies to a civil proceeding in the Justice Courts. Before entering a default judgm ent against an individual defendant, the plaintiff m ust file with the court an affidavit stating whether or not the defendant is in the military service, showing necessary facts to support the affidavit, or stating that the plaintiff is unable to determ ine whether or not the defendant is in military service, if that is the case. The requirem ent for an affidavit m ay be satisfied by a written, signed docum ent declared to be true under penalty of perjury. If it appears that the defendant is in military service, the court m ay not enter a judgm ent until after the court appoints an attorney to represent the defendant. If the court is unable to determ ine if the defendant is in military service, the court m ay require plaintiff to file a bond in an an ount approved by the court. A person who makes or uses an affidavit under this Act knowing it to be false, m ay be fined or im prisoned or both. 50 U.S.C. App. 501 et seq.
