The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2022 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Crane County from the same properties in both the 2021 tax year and the 2022 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Crane County may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Crane County is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2022 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 27, 2022 AT 9:45 AM AT Crane County Commissioner's Courtroom, Courthouse.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Crane County is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Crane Co. Commissioner's Court of Crane County at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

No-New-Revenue Maintenance and Operations Rate Adjustments

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures

The Crane County spent \$30,355 from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals in criminal or civil proceedings in accordance with the schedule of fees adopted under Article 26.05, Code of Criminal Procedure and to fund the operations of a public defender's office under Article 26.044, Code of Criminal Procedure, less the amount of any state grants received. For the current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's indigent defense compensation expenditures is \$4,251. This increased the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate by \$0.000072/\$100.
